

## Notice of an Application for a Faculty

Has presented an Application in the Court for the grant of Faculty, whereof the following are the general terms:

Installation of an ambulant disabled WC and associated Teapoint in the area used as a vestry External works comprise potable water connection from approx. 35m away from church property ; introduction of a cesspit to hold effluent from the WC and tea point, rebuilding of disassembled organ. in order to provide water for the WC and Tea point , potable water has to brought from 35m outside the church boundary. The 22mm dia. pipe is to be laid in the existing road verge and taken onto the original church access drive, to the boundary of the Church, then in the existing drainage channel around the NE part of the Church to the designated point of entry. The waste from the WC and Tea-point is to be via a macerator at the rear of the WC and taken through the stone wall to the exterior below ground level. The 22mm dia waste pipe is to be laid across the medieval church yard to the area designated suitable for a cesspit in the North Western part of the Churchyard. It is anticipated that with a medieval burial ground that graves will be disturbed and the presence of an on-site Archaeologist will be required to deal with any bones encountered.
